HIGHLANDER GOLF - The TWH Boys went to High Meadow Ranch on Friday and Saturday, January 27-28, to compete in the Magnolia High School Shootout. The nice weather must have suited them, finishing in first and second places.

The Highlander B Team captured first with a 2-day total of 609 (302-307). Freshman Carter Patterson tied for the tournament championship with rounds of 76-72 (148), but lost the gold medal in a scorecard playoff. Also contributing were Mike Durio's 76-76 (152), Mason Raine's 75-79 (154), Chester Wang's 75-80 (155), and Chris Reina's 80-82 (162).

The Highlander A Team took the silver medals, led by John Krapf's 151 (77-74). Others competing were Kyle Southard's 77-76 (153), Andrew Ertel's 156 (77-79), Diego Trevino's 156 (78-78), and Fred Wedel's 158 (77-81). Their team totals were 308-307 (615).

The Highlander C Team was led by Austin Shaw's 157 (77-80) and Brantley Blasingame's 157 (76-81). Others contributing were Alex Myers' 163 (83-80), David Schack's 164 (81-83), and Collins Lenfant's 164 (79-85). Their team total was 637 (313-324).

The Woodlands Junior Varsity boys captured the silver medals as hosts of JV Boys Spring Invitational at the Oaks Course on Thursday, January 26. Twenty-two Highlanders competed in soggy-but-sunny conditions, taking second, sixth, eleventh, and nineteenth places. Leading the runner-up Highlander A Team was silver medalist Harrison Borden who shot a round of 79. Others contributing to the medal win were Brady Price (80), Brandon Pender (84), Jack Dever (90), and Juan Luna (94). Their team total was 333, losing by only one shot.

The Highlander B Team finished in sixth place, led by Jake Boyer's (83). Also competing were Austin Wentz (86), Matt Wesling (87), Erik Martinez (88), and Matt McKaig (97). Their team total was 344. The Highlander C Team took eleventh place, paced by Dylan Boster's 88. Also contributing were Alex Fruci (90), Courtlin Sherman (94), Weston Bruce (95), and Brittain Sherman (97). Their team total was 367.

Coming in nineteenth place was the Highlander D Team. Travis McAtee led the way with a 95, followed by Brendan Adcock (104), JJ Johansen (105), Sam Wagner (108), and Tom Leonard (120). Their team total was 412. Competing as individuals were Ben Jones (103) and Oscar Munoz (109).

HIGHLANDER BASKETBALL - With 4 games to play, the Highlander JV basketball team is closing in on a district championship. After beating Lufkin 72-32 on Tuesday night, the squad sits alone atop the district standings. If the team, 8-0 in district and 22-2 overall, can win 3 of the next 4 games they alone will claim the title. Second place teams Kingwood and College Park both occupy a spot on next week's schedule. Remaining home games include Kingwood, Tuesday February 7th, and the season finale vs. Conroe on Tuesday February 14th.

The Sophomore Boys Basketball team is having a great season, currently sitting at 18 wins with 0 losses. The team has four games remaining and is hoping to cap off an undefeated season as well as being district champions. If the team is able to accomplish this feat, it will be the second year in a row that the Sophomore team will have finished the season undefeated.

The Green Team has won two out of their last three games to move to 11-10 on the season and 4-4 in district. In their 46-44 defeat of Conroe, Alec Jenkins led all scorers with 12 points. The Freshmen Red team is 18 – 2 overall and 7 -1 in district play. The Red team defeated Conroe 50 – 41. Robert Pickett, Elijah Yates, Mark Mitchell, and Trevor Disatell were players of the game. Their next game was against Atascocita. They beat them 55 -32. Players of the game were T.J. McMickle, Chris Argast, Dylan Radach, Arinzie Nwakwo and Mason Mills.
