THE DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

Conroe Independent School District covers an area of 348 square miles. More than 50,000 students attend five high schools, six junior high schools, eleven intermediate schools, 29 elementary schools and five special programs. In addition, two magnet school program sites serve Conroe ISD. An aggressive building program has tried to keep pace with rapid growth in the district.

The Woodlands, one of the nation's premier master planned communities, is home to more than 97,000 people. Nestled among 28,000 acres of lush forest, The Woodlands is just 27 miles north of downtown Houston and is an important regional center for more than 1700 businesses. Most residents in this upscale suburban area are employed in professional or managerial positions.

The developer's vision of blending nature with business and community has helped create a lifestyle unique to The Woodlands.

THE ACADEMIC YEAR

The Woodlands High School uses accelerated block scheduling. The school year is divided into two 18-week terms (August-January and January-June), with two 9-week semesters in each term. Class periods are 90 minutes long, and there are four periods in the school day. Students may earn up to four credits per term or eight credits per school year. There are a few traditional classes which are 45 minutes long for the school year.

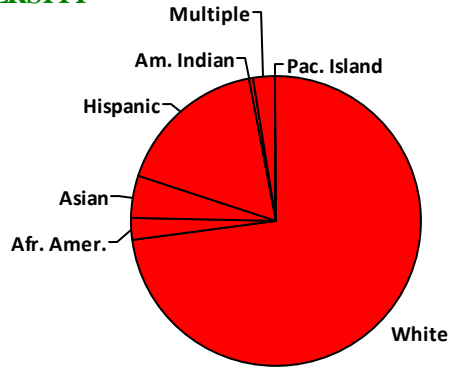
