Teacher course advisements will be made during the week of January 21st through January 24th. These individual advisements can be found in **Parent Access (PAC)** and/or **Student Access (SAC)** under the 4 Year Plan tab.
- Elective Fair and Incoming 10th, 11th, and 12th Grade Parent Information Night is Monday, February 3rd. The Elective Fair is from 6:00 – 7:00 pm in the senior campus cafeteria. The Parent Information Night is at 7:00 pm in the senior campus Auditorium.
