Major Changes for 2020 testing

- All exams will be taken online at home unless schools reopen prior to test date.
- Exam dates - May 11 - 22 (late tests are available as a back-up) - **PLAN ON THE REGULAR DATE**
- Submission date for 2D, 3D, Drawing, and Comp Sci Principles = May 26
- Exams will be 45 minutes - free response only, no multiple choice
- Exam Content has been adjusted - Teachers will communicate the content that will be assessed by College Board

Major Changes for 2020 testing

- You may use a desktop computer, laptop, tablet, or a smartphone (not suggested but will work) for your exams.
- Exam responses
 - ◆ may be typed directly into the online system
 - ◆ Hand-written responses are acceptable - take a picture and upload
- Calculators are acceptable but, per College Board, are not required
- All College Board-approved accommodations will be provided.
 - ◆ More information will be released by College Board

Major Changes for 2020 testing

- Exams are open book/notes. Use the QR code to view CB open note test-taking tips.
- Questions are designed so answers cannot be found online or in a textbook.
- Like all AP exams, 100% of the work must be your own. You may not consult with others during testing.
- Test security measures are extensive so do not copy, cut and paste, or upload from another source.
- Work alone.

Major Changes for 2020 testing

- Cheating of any type will result in cancelled exam scores and may result in -
 - ◆ A denial of future College Board exam opportunities
 - ◆ Cheating reported to your colleges
 - ◆ School discipline
- Exam security includes plagiarism detection software and other digital security tools.
- Written responses will be sent to your teacher prior to scoring to determine if the work is consistent with prior work.

The most important things you need to do now -

1. Log in to your MyAP account and **check your email address.**
 - a. **All communication regarding your exam will be sent to this email address.**
 - i. This should be an email address you check daily - **NOT** your CISD email.
 - ii. To change your email address, log in to MyAP, click on your name, click on Account Settings, scroll down to your email address.
 - b. Confirm your selected school is correct under the MyAP Profile > Registration
 - c. Complete the practice login provided by College Board later this month.
 - d. Students will receive an AP credential or link that will allow them to log-in to take the exam.

The most important things you need to do later this month -

2. Check your technology and let us know if you need anything for testing. Contact your Counselor or Mrs. Shepard
3. Seniors - choose where to have your scores sent in MyAP:
 - a. Log in to MyAP, go to My AP Profile, and go to Score Send tab

- b. Select collèges
 - c. This can be updated through early June.

Know the time and date for your exam(s):

Plan to log in thirty minutes prior to your exam.

Complete the practice exam and know what materials you need for testing - scratch paper, pen, book ...

Find a good place to test: quiet, a flat surface with room for your materials, someplace to plug in your device

AP Test Taking Tips

- **Open book/open note exams are not easy.**
 - Finding facts, formulas, or other information in your notes is only one step to answering an exam question
- **You still need to prepare for the exam.**
 - You still need to know how to apply the information efficiently and correctly. This takes preparation.
- **More materials aren't always better.**
 - The more time you spend looking for information, the less time you'll have to use it in writing your answer.
- **You should not copy responses from notes or resources.**
 - Exam questions will ask you to apply concepts from your notes and resources in new ways. Copying what you have done in the past won't produce a satisfactory answer.
- **Your class notes are better than internet searches.**
 - The internet can be a source of misinformation, diverging opinions, and manipulated content.
- **Collaborating with others is not considered acceptable open notes**
 - It is strictly forbidden to give or receive aid during the exam.
