ACADEMICS:

On May 6, Algebra 1 students will take the STAAR End-of-Course Algebra 1 exam. The EOC Algebra 1 exam is a four-hour exam. After four hours of testing, students will report to lunch in the cafeteria prior to reporting to their period 7 classroom. Geometry and Algebra 2 students will take a benchmark and receive an EOC Biology review. Students will have a lunch break in the cafeteria during this time. Shuttles will run after school only. THE WOODLANDS HIGH SCHOOL FINAL EXAM EXEMPTION POLICY: Students are only eligible for exemption from final exams, not midterm exams. Seniors are the only students in the Fall semester that may be exempt from final exams for half-credit courses which have a final exam, not a midterm, in the Fall semester. Students must maintain a 90-100 class average for the semester (18-weeks) and have no more than 3 absences for the semester or have

an 85-89 class average for the semester (18- weeks) with no more than 2 absences for the semester. In addition, the following criteria apply as well: 1. Seniors must meet the criteria listed above and the discipline requirement listed below. Seniors may be exempt from all their final exams both in the Fall and Spring semesters. Seniors may not be exempt from midterm exams in the Fall semester. 2. Freshmen, Sophomores, and Juniors may be exempt from all their spring final exams. Students must meet the criteria listed above and the discipline requirement listed below. Underclassmen are not eligible for exemptions from final exams or midterms in the Fall semester. 3. Absences include all days missed: Excused and Unexcused. Pre-approved absences, funerals, DOC's, and hospital stays count against exemptions. 4. School field trips, athletic events, UIL events, HCPs (health care provider - student attended school part of the day), PREs (present), GLOs (grade level office), ECLs (election clerk), CTZs (citizenship), NATs (naturalization), CVs (up to two College Visits) and religious holidays are not considered absences. 5. A student granted a final exam exemption must still attend that class during the final exam period. Failure to attend will result in a zero or an incomplete for that course. 6. Any student that has served SAC, DAEP, or OSS while enrolled in a course during the semester of the final exam is not eligible for a final exam exemption for that particular course.

COLLEGE AND CAREER:

SENIORS: All students will visit the college and career center over the next few days with their government and economics teacher to complete a CISD graduation survey and to tell us where they want their final transcript to be sent. Remember that a final transcript can only be sent from institution to institution, so if you want your own copy you will need to visit the school in the summer and pay for a copy of an unofficial one. Once you reach alumni status (August 2019) you can order transcripts from the alumni section of our school webpage.

GPA Exemptions for the Classes of 2020 and 2021: The counselors are currently accepting GPA Exemption forms for all current sophomores and juniors for the next school year (2019-2020). The GPA exemption is in place to allow students to exempt up to two credits during their high school career. Some current juniors took advantage of the GPA exemption this year. If you would like to see further information about the GPA exempt courses, please refer to the Counselor Corner website for more information. If you have any questions, please contact your child's counselor. The final day to turn in the GPA Exempt application form is Thursday, May 30, 2019. **Reminder: Once this course is put in place and the student starts the course in the fall, the decision cannot be reversed.**

Note: If your student wants to wait and see their final grades this semester, there will be another opportunity to enroll for GPA exemptions in the fall semester. **Fall GPA Exempt forms will be accepted through the third week of school. The fall deadline is September 6, 2019.**

Summer School Registration: Summer school registration began on Tuesday, April 23, on our campus. If your student is interested in taking an accelerated course such as health, government, etc., you can go ahead and take care of that registration starting on April 23rd. In addition, if your student needs summer school for credit recovery, registration for credit recovery also starts on Tuesday. However, many parents and students wait until after final exams to register for credit recovery. The final registration deadline for on campus registration is not until June 6, 2019.

Quick Reminder: If your child is able to average the first semester failing grade with the second semester passing grade together for an overall grade of 70 or higher, summer school may not be needed. However, if a student fails second semester, the two semester averages cannot be averaged together for credit recovery. All students have to pass the second semester in order to get second semester credit.
