

Difference Between Dual Credit Classes & AP Classes

	Dual Credit Course	AP Course
GPA	English and History are 6.0 in the fall and 6.0 in the spring College Algebra is spring only 6.0 (Honors 5.0 in the fall)	All AP classes are 6.0 credit in the fall and 6.0 in the spring.
Level of course	Taught at a college level and require 2-3 hours of work per class per night. Must qualify to take.	Taught at a college level and require 2-3 hours of work per class per night.
How to Earn College Credit	Credit is earned per semester. Send Lone Star transcript to University and they will determine what credits you have are able to earn.	University determines credit earned based on AP test score.
Which Universities Recognize	Automatically recognized by public Universities in Texas, however, out of state and private are now recognizing this credit or may want to review a portfolio or a syllabus.	AP classes are nationally recognized.
