### The District and the Community

Conroe Independent School District covers an area of 348 square miles. It is the 11th largest school district in Texas, comprised of more than 65,000 students attending more than 60 schools across six traditional feeder zones and one academic alternative high school. Three specialized competitive magnet programs are available for students.

The Woodlands, one of the nation's premier master planned communities, is home to more than 115,000 people. Nestled among 28,000 acres of lush forest, The Woodlands is just 27 miles north of downtown Houston and is an important regional center for more than 1,700 businesses. Most residents in this upscale suburban area are employed in professional or managerial positions.

The developer's vision of blending nature with business and community has helped create a lifestyle that is unique to The Woodlands.

### The Academic Year

The Woodlands High School uses alternating block scheduling. The school year is divided into two 18-week semesters (August—December and January—May). Class periods are 90 minutes long, and there are four periods in each school day with four different courses the next school day. These eight courses alternate for the school year (36 weeks). Students may earn up to eight credits per year.

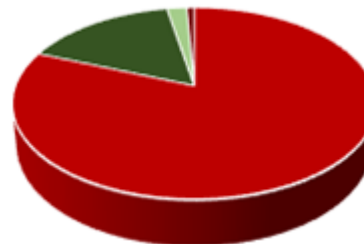
