AP Course

All AP classes are 6.0 credit in the fall and 6.0 in the spring.

Level of course

Taught at a college level and requires 2-3 hours of work per class per night.

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How to Earn College Credit

Credit earned per semester. Send your Lone Star transcript to the university you will be attending. They will determine what credits you are able to earn. Recognized by public universities in Texas. Out of state and private are now recognizing this credit or may want to review a portfolio or a syllabus.

University determines credit earned based on AP test score.

AP classes are nationally recognized.
